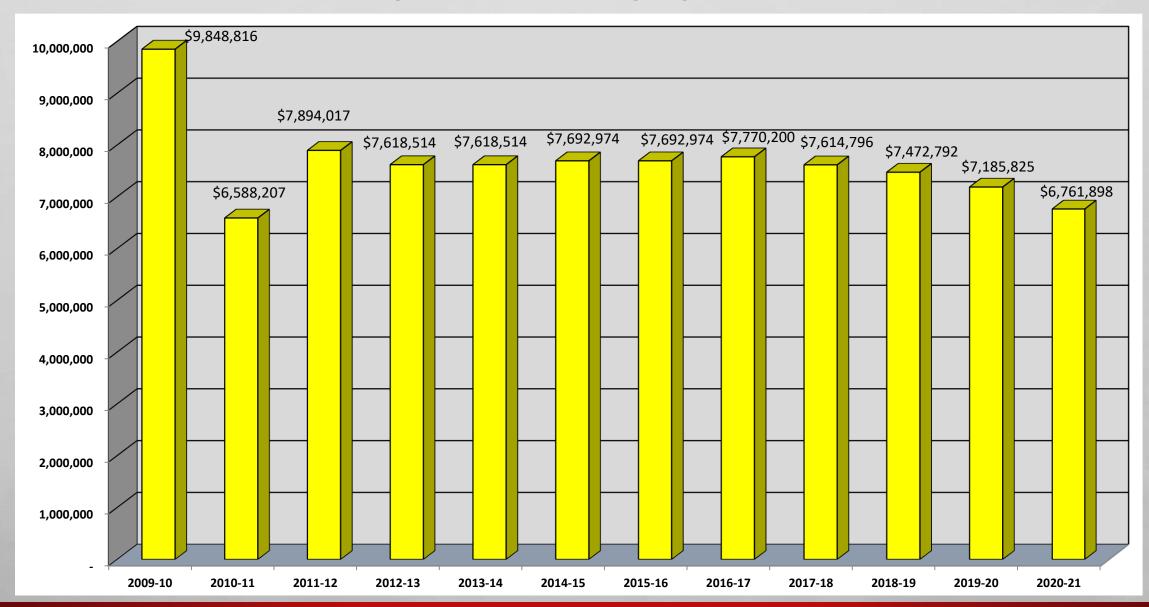
### STATE AID HISTORY:

- The Township of Ocean receives \$3,086,918 less in state aid than was received in 2009-2010 (\$9,848,816 vs \$6,761,898) 11 years ago
- In 2017-2018 Ocean lost \$155,404 in state aid
- In 2018-2019 Ocean lost \$142,004 in state aid
- In 2019-2020 Ocean lost \$286,967 in state aid
- In 2020-2021 Ocean will lose \$423,927 in state aid
- ➤ Since 2017–2018 the district has lost a total of \$1,008,302 in state aid





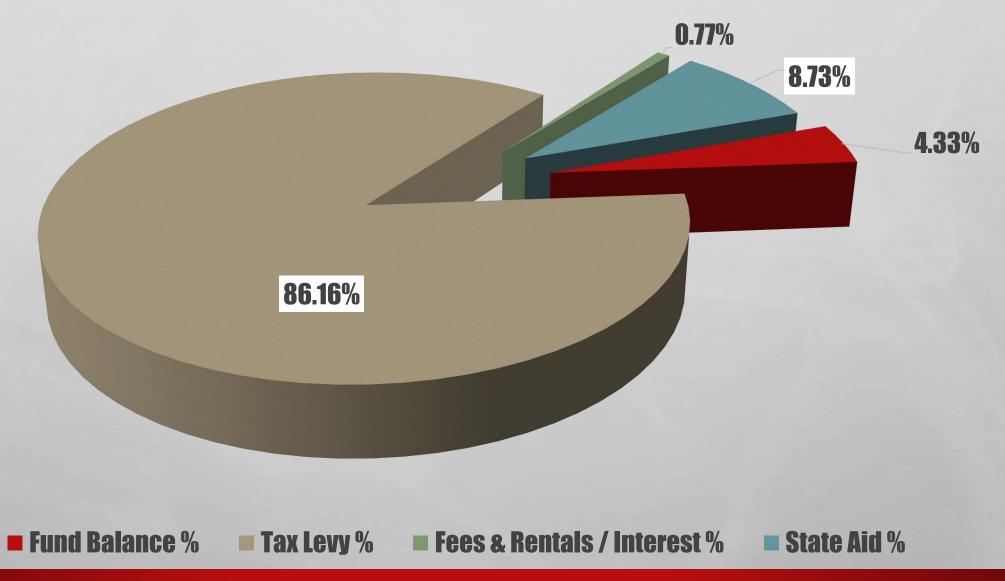

## STATE AID FUTURE:

- The state has designated Ocean as an "overfunded" school district
- In 2021-2022 Ocean will lose \$525,116
- In 2022-2023 Ocean will lose \$491,764
- In 2023-2024 Ocean will lose \$305,788
- In 2024-2025 Ocean will lose \$96,565

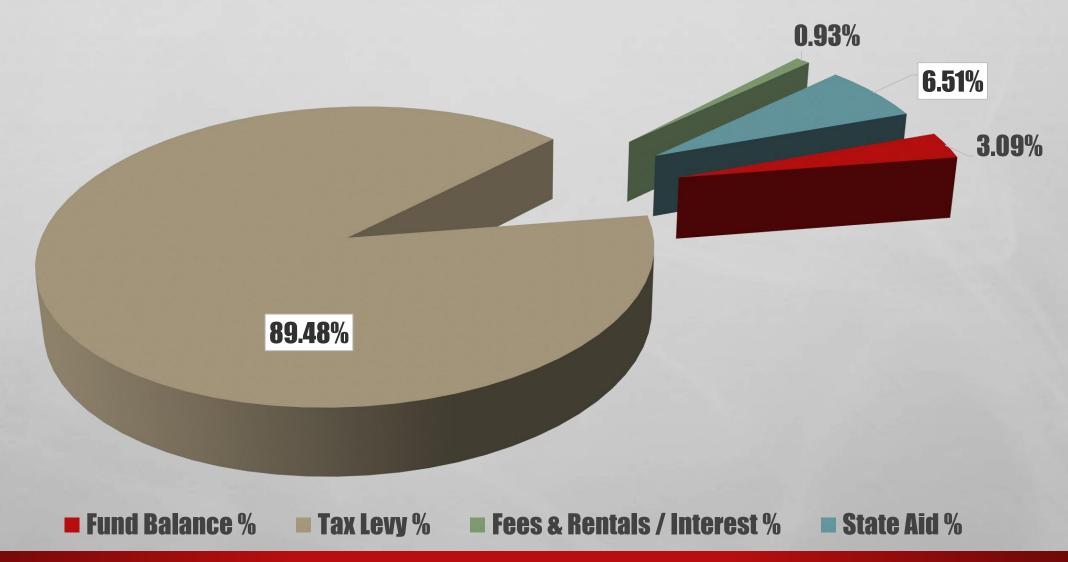


- FUTURE STATE AID LOSS WILL BE \$1,419,232 Total state aid loss since 2017-2018 will be \$2,427,534 or a 31% reduction of state aid

# SCHOOL BUDGET TAX LEVY CAP, CAP WAIVERS AND BANKED CAP

- > STATE IMPOSED 2% CAP ON THE TAX LEVY: The revenues received from the tax payers (Tax Levy) are not allowed to grow greater than 2% in any one year.
- ➤ CAP WAIVERS: However, the state recognizes certain instances in which they will grant a waiver to exceed the 2% if the District qualifies. If the District does not qualify and the District wishes to exceed the 2% tax levy cap a question would need to go on the ballot and be approved by the community for the amount over the 2% to be added to the school budget.
- ➤ BANKED CAP: Also, the amounts that were below the 2% cap and the amounts the district qualified for waivers (Health Benefits) in the 3 proceeding years totaled \$1,266,572. This is the amount that was available to increase the 2020-2021 budget over the 2% tax levy cap (or 3.93%).
- ➤ In the past 7 years only one year did the district utilize a cap waiver from the state for qualified Health Benefit increases. The other six years were at or below the 2% cap with a 7 year average of a 1.56% increase.





# 2020-2021 SCHOOL TAX LEVY INCREASE:

- > Tax Levy Increase = \$1,144,852 1.75%
- Based on individual assessment increases a homeowner's tax increase will vary
- However, comparing an average residential assessment in to 2019 to the projected 2020 average residential assessment
- An average homeowner would see a \$10.22 per month increase or \$122.63 for the year in estimated school taxes

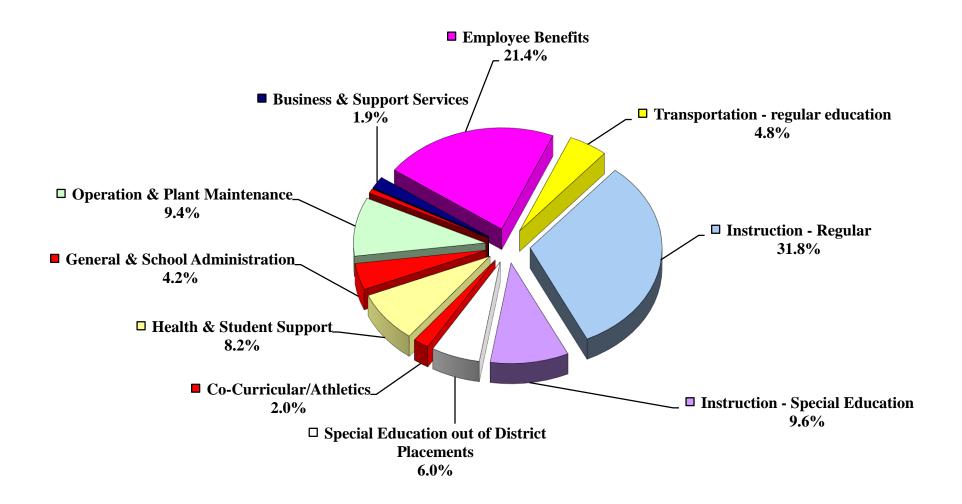

### Where your Money Goes as a % of Budget





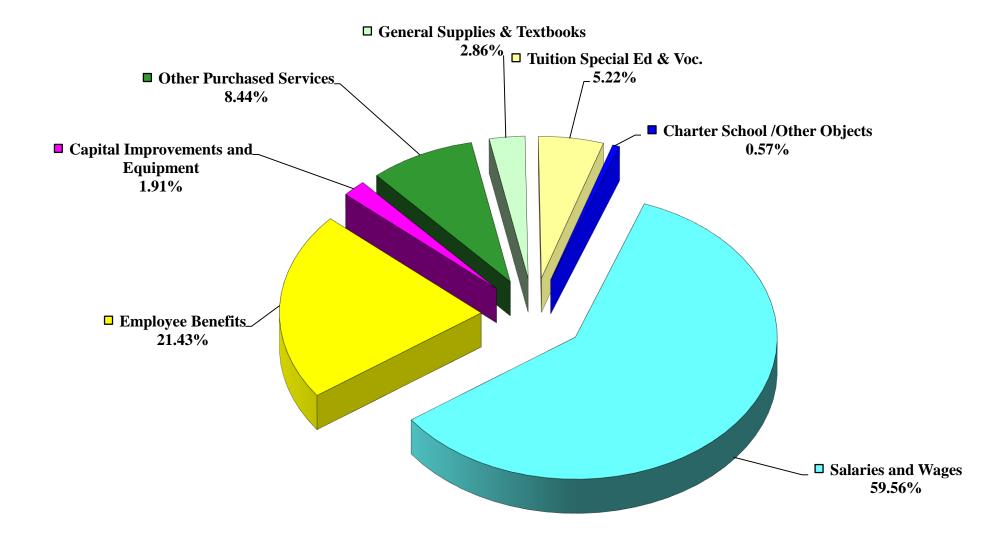

### **POSITIVE FACTORS:**

- Negotiated agreement with the teachers union and mutually agreed upon changes to the Medical base benefit plan for employees and changes to the Prescription plan co-pays and the utilization management plan
- ➤ Health Benefit line item (Medical and Prescription only) there will be no increase due to the negotiated agreement and a favorable rate increase/decrease
- Continue implementation of employee health benefits premium contributions, ranging from 3% to 35% of premiums (depending on salary and plan coverage of the individual employee)
  - ✓ Over \$2,590,000 in employee contributions for the 2020-2021 budget
- ➤ 250 KW solar panel system on the Intermediate School roof and 135 KW solar panel system at the High School and have generated \$388,854 in solar renewable energy credits that have been sold (SRECs) and we save approximately \$60,000 per year on our electric bills due to generation of electricity from the solar panels
- > Alyssa's law state funding the district qualifies for \$189,594 for allowable expenses
