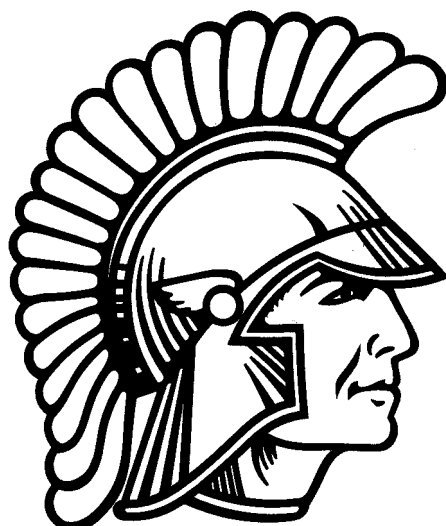

## ACADEMIC TEAM

The Academic Team encourages students who excel in academic trivia and competition. The members of the Academic Team need to be well-rounded. The Team participates in many competitions throughout the year. Most competitions are in the “Jeopardy” format of five categories with multiple questions in each. The students are allowed to confer with their teammates before answering. The categories cover almost every topic imaginable.

## ART CLUB

The Art Club’s objective is to evoke creativity and embrace the talents of the student body. Embracing our talents gives us a sense of identity that is essential in life. Art Club will also build character traits needed for the workplace. In Art Club we will have to work in groups and collaborate; unlike in art class where we each work individually. Bouncing ideas off one another will improve our communication skills.

## BAND

**Marching Band:** The Marching Spartans play at all home and away varsity football games and certain school events throughout the year. The band has performed in a variety of venues such as Disney World, Disney Land, Canada, Virginia, Ohio, Washington D.C., and the Yankee opening day, playoff, and World Series Parade. The band also performs at several local holiday parades and the All Shore Marching Band Festival. Please Note: It is possible to participate in Marching Band as well as a sport or other activity.

**Concert Band:** The schedule for Concert Band includes three concerts throughout the year plus the OTHS Graduation ceremony. Concert band prepares their wide variety of music during the school year in band class. Students in Concert Band may also audition to perform in the All Shore Symphonic Band, which is made up of students in high schools throughout Monmouth and Ocean counties.

**Jazz Band:** Jazz Band is an auditioned ensemble that plays at all band concerts and select choral concerts. Jazz Band also performs at extra performances during the school year such as during the lunch periods, during pep rallies, and before holiday breaks. Jazz Band has also been asked to perform at outside venues for conventions held at places like the Sheraton in Eatontown and Ocean Place Resort and Spa in Long Branch. Jazz playing and soloing are stressed for members of this group. Students in Jazz Band may also audition to perform in the All Shore Jazz Band, which is made up of students in high schools throughout Monmouth and Ocean counties.

**Pep Band:** Pep band is a smaller version of the Marching Band that performs at select home Boys and Girls basketball games. Pep band plays a variety of music in the stands of the basketball games. Pep Band has also been asked to perform at several in school events such as pep rallies and parades through the hallways. Pep Band has also performed at local events like the Ocean Township Fall Festival and the Asbury Park Polar Bear Plunge.

**Pit Orchestra:** The Pit Orchestra is composed of musicians who want to play in the orchestra for the Spring Musical. Music for this group is very advanced and requires outside independent practice time. Instrumentation depends on what show is being performed that year.

## **BAND FRONT**

The Band Front is comprised of Flag Twirling. The Flag Twirlers provide a positive learning environment that will develop a lifelong appreciation and love for music, dance, and the arts. They work closely with the Ocean Township High School Marching Band. The instruction focuses on techniques, personal discipline, graciousness, positive self-image, and physical wellness. Flag twirling helps build a student's creative being, allowing them to explore and produce works and ideas on their own.

## **CABLE YOUTH NETWORK (CYN)**

The Cable Youth Network is open to all students in the high school that wish to be involved with media or video communications. The club meets regularly for planning sessions and job assignments. Students wishing to be involved in this club may contribute by planning short video segments, recording various programs or scenes in or out of school or editing final pieces. A majority of the student's efforts will contribute to Spartan Update episodes. Formal responsibilities of club leadership are possible for experienced members. The CYN club is a year round extracurricular activity.

## **CHARACTER CLUB**

The Character Club is for students who are concerned with the role of "character" in today's society. The Club plans character-building activities for club members as well as for the entire student body. Members are asked to serve as role models in the areas of the six pillars of character: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship. Some of our annual events include Mix It Up Day, which promotes tolerance of differences, student training, and/or speakers, which provide insight on how to exhibit good character, and charity concerts, which raise funds for worthy causes.

## **CHESS CLUB**

Chess Club provides students with opportunities to learn how to play, develop strategies, and compete in tournaments against other students and schools. In addition to the club, there is also a chess team that consists of the top five players from the club. These five players represent the school in the Shore Chess Conference and compete on a regular basis from December through March. Team and individual competition are also available to club members through in-house tournaments.

## **CHORUS**

The OTHS Choral Program is comprised of two curricular choirs plus two after school ensembles. The Concert Choir is open to all students in grades 9-12 and meets during study hall every day. The Chamber Choir is a select ensemble that is open to students in grades 10-12 through audition. Designed for dedicated, talented students, the Chamber Choir rehearses challenging repertoire and performs frequently. The Women's Ensemble is an after school all-female choir that rehearses a variety of repertoire. It is open to students grades 9-12 by audition only. The newest vocal ensemble to OTHS is the Noteworthy Gentlemen, an all-male acapella group that performs at various events during the year. The choirs put on a large winter and spring concert each year in addition to community performances and other trips throughout the Northeast.

## **DEEPLY ROOTED**

The mission of the Ocean Township High School Deeply Rooted Club is to provide an environment that encourages discussions and activities of interest to those who wish to learn more about the history, contribution, and accomplishments of minorities. All members of the Ocean Township High School student body are welcome. The club's emphasis is on the development of philosophies and values, which will benefit club members and our community. The class officers help to schedule and plan participation in school events such as Homecoming and our biggest is the Junior Prom.

## **KALEIDOSCOPE**

Kaleidoscope is an organization and support group that works to raise awareness, provide support, and promote acceptance of individual differences and rights. Its main

objective is to cultivate an environment in which every child learns to respect and accept all people regardless of sexual orientation, or gender identity/expression. As a club, we work to educate the student body and to spread kindness and acceptance through our outreach to include all people no matter how they identify.

## **KEY CLUB**

The Key Club is open to all members of the student body. The objectives of the club are to develop initiative and leadership, provide experience in living and working together, develop and promote good citizenship skills, serve the school and community, and cooperate with the school principal, local Kiwanis, State, and International Key Clubs. The club organizes a car wash / fundraisers and a food drive. It assists at school sponsored events (Back to School Night, Plays and concerts, Orientation), and offers support to volunteer organizations in the community. ## **LIGHTING**

The Lighting Crew provides the lighting for the Drama Club's fall and spring productions as well as the lighting for Mr. Spartan, National Honor Society Induction Ceremony, Spartan Scholar, and other school and non-school events.

## **LITERARY MAGAZINE (AFTERGLOW)**

Afterglow provides an opportunity for students to explore their creative talents, enhance their organizational skills and hone their business acumen. The culminating product of the year's activities is a literary magazine created by students. Selections, publications, and distribution are all generated by student efforts. Afterglow welcomes students who are considering a career in writing, business, or the performing arts. As a fundraiser project, the Afterglow performs two coffeehouses, which are designed primarily to showcase students' literary talent and artistic expression.

## **MATHEMATICS TEAM**

The Mathematics Club is open to all interested students in grades 9-12. Outstanding achievement in Mathematics is not a prerequisite. The Mathematics Club holds monthly meetings. The Mathematics Club runs the Mathematics Awards ceremony held at the end of the year to recognize achievement in mathematics from grades 6 through 12. Students with a flair for mathematics may try out for the Mathematics team. The team participates in The New Jersey Shore Mathematics League, which meets 6 times during the year for competitions against shore area Math Teams.

## **MOCK TRIAL**

The Mock Trial Club is a nationwide activity in which students simulate trial proceedings, acting as lawyers and witnesses. The trials deal with real-life scenarios and also incorporate current laws, statutes, and case law. Mock Trial helps students

develop speaking and critical thinking skills in a trial-like setting. Club members will discover how to become effective attorneys, arguing for the side of the prosecution/plaintiff or the defense. Participants can also act as witnesses testifying about facts and case evidence. Mock Trial club members will compete against each other and have the opportunity to compete at the county, state, and national levels

## **NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY**

The National Honor Society Chapter of Ocean Township High School is a duly chartered and affiliated chapter of this prestigious national organization. Eligibility for the National Honor Society is based on a student's performance in ninth, tenth, and eleventh grade. Standards for selection are established by the national office of NHS and have been revised to meet our local chapter.

## **NEWSPAPER (*SPARTAN SPIRIT*)**

The Spartan Spirit is a co-curricular activity designed to encourage and instruct students in journalism as well as the layout and design of a newspaper. Anyone interested in the art of investigating, organizing, writing, and presenting the news is encouraged to join this activity. The Spartan Spirit newspaper utilizes a digital platform that makes keeping content current. The newspaper allows for students to participate at several levels of involvement and our club is open for new members all year.

## **PEER LEADERS**

Peer Leaders is a peer leadership organization dedicated to preventing destructive decisions, particularly underage drinking and drug use, and impaired driving. Peer Leaders believes that young people can have fun, enjoy life, and nurture positive, personal relationships without the distraction and distortion of alcohol. We seek to demonstrate positive and attractive alternatives for teenagers. Peer Leaders will support students' social emotional well-being, good decision making, and provide mentoring for younger students.

## **SCIENCE CLUB**

The Science Club is designed to provide a forum for students to investigate scientific issues of their interest. Activities are as varied as the membership. Opportunities to attend science-related conferences, symposia, and field trips. For example, in the past, students have engaged in various fundraising activities and donated profits to the local SPCA and to our school courtyard project. Some students utilize the greenhouse to grow garden plants. The opportunity to compete in the NJ Science League, Chemistry Olympiad, and other potential venues that enhance the science experience. In addition, students have held information sessions to educate peers on current issues in the science community. The club members prepare to engage district elementary students with "hands-on" experiments and demonstrations as well as to network with TOIS science students. Some students also attend science fairs and other symposia to present results from their own original research projects.

## **SENIOR CLASS**

This group is essentially the entire grade 12 class. However, the homeroom consists of the officers elected in the summer/spring of the previous school year. The officers run weekly meetings to discuss related business. All members of the senior class are encouraged to attend and participate in all meetings. The duties of the class officers include fundraising, organizing social events and class activities, and voicing student concerns. These representatives are the role models for their class, showing leadership and direction toward successful class involvement. They are responsible for generating to the rest of the class any news; information or activities that the class is currently involved in to promote class spirit so all can be involved. There are various activities and fundraisers throughout the year including the Senior Prom.

## **SOPHOMORE CLASS**

This group is essentially the entire grade 10 class. However, the homeroom consists of the officers elected in the summer/spring of the previous school year. All members of the sophomore class are encouraged to attend and participate in all meetings. The purpose of the class officers is to provide leadership and direction for the sophomore class as a whole. Recognizing this, the role of the advisor is to cultivate and nurture those qualities deemed appropriate for leadership in all the sophomore class officers. Meetings are held weekly. Various activities and fundraising events are held throughout the year including service learning projects, sophomore lock-in, and a host of other activities.

## **SPARTAN DANCERS**

The Spartan Dance Team is the first dance team for OTHS. This group provides an opportunity for dancers to perform and explore their choreographic talents. Dancers are required to meet for rehearsals and learn pieces to perform for the district as well as concerts and competitions throughout the school year. Auditions will be held in the beginning of the school year. The Spartan Dancers perform for Coffee House performances, talent shows, basketball games, pep rallies, and are encouraged to try out for the spring musical for the Drama Club. The culmination of the season is a performance called Ocean Dance Theater where every Spartan Dancer performs with various other dancers within the school.

## **STAGE CREW**

The Stage Crew helps to design and build the stage sets for the fall drama and spring musical. They meet with the Drama Club to watch the rehearsals before design completion and then they practice with the actors to learn how to set the stage and move props and scenery during the production. The crew is part of the production during the run of the play. After the performances, they are responsible for disassembling the set and cleaning the stage area.

## STUDENT COUNCIL

Student Council representatives are elected by their class to represent the student body. The basic purpose of the Student Council is to support the school and community, address social issues affecting the school, raise school spirit and participation, honor leaders and good citizens, and serve as liaisons to represent and be the voice of the students at PTSA, Board of Education, and Affirmative Action meetings. Some of the activities run by the Student Council are: Blood Drive, Holiday Toy Drive, Gift Certificates for the Pediatric Aids Unit at Jersey Shore, Fund Raising for State Charities, Leadership Wall of Fame, Voter Registration, Elections, attending State Conventions, Showcase Displays, Walk-a-Thon, and Halloween Contest.

## TECHNOLOGY STUDENT ASSOCIATION (TSA)

**Technology Student Association (TSA) portion of this club:** The Technology Student Association (TSA) is a national organization of students engaged in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Open to students enrolled in or who have completed technology education courses. Members learn through exciting competitive events, leadership opportunities, and much more. The diversity of activities makes TSA a positive experience for every student.

**Big Red Robotics portion of this club:** Big Red Robotics is Ocean Township High School's organization for students interested in pursuing a career in Robotics, Automation, Machine Learning, Artificial Intelligence, or any related STEM field. This highly competitive club's enrollment has been growing steadily over the years and participants compete in fun and challenging regional and national competitions.

## ULTIMATE FRISBEE CLUB

Frisbee Club's goal is to get more OTHS students active while creating or enhancing Frisbee skills. This club will benefit the school community because it will host events where students of the school pay to play, and then donate this money to a charitable cause. Any student will be able to join this club.

## VARSITY CLUB

The Varsity Club is a very well established organization for all athletes. Members work together as a group to raise money to fund scholarships and to buy new equipment for the athletes. The club also runs clothing sales to raise money to fund the biggest event of the year, which is the fashion show. Money raised from the fashion show provides scholarships to the graduating athletes. This organization is growing each year and flourishes from the support received from the athletes of Ocean Township High School.

## **VOLLEYBALL CLUB**
