
STATE AID HISTORY:

- The Township of Ocean receives \$2,662,991 less in state aid than was received in 2009-2010 (\$9,848,816 vs \$7,185,825) 10 years ago
- ➤ The Township of Ocean receives \$2,961,895 less in state aid than was received in 1999-2000 (\$10,147,720 vs \$7,185,825) 20 years ago
- In 2017–2018 the district lost \$155,000 in aid <u>after</u> the budget was approved by the state
- In 2018-2019 the district had a short lived Increase in state aid in the amount of \$464,924 <u>BUT</u> then lost \$606,928 for a net loss of \$142,004
- In 2019-2020 the district is scheduled to lose another \$286,967






STATE AID HISTORY








STATE AID as a % of THE BUDGET

STATE AID FUTURE:

The state has designated Ocean as an "overfunded" school district – we disagree...

In 2020-2021 Ocean will lose \$441,709

In 2021-2022 Ocean will lose \$547,142

In 2022-2023 Ocean will lose \$512,392

In 2023-2024 Ocean will lose \$318,614


In 2024-2025 Ocean will lose \$100,615

- DOE Litigation has been filed by 8 districts hearing May 20th














PROJECTED REVENUES 2024-2025







SCHOOL BUDGET TAX LEVY:

TAX LEVY HISTORY

2012–2013	LESS than the state imposed 2% cap	1.81%
2013–2014	LESS than the state imposed 2% cap	1.35%
2014–2015	LESS than the state imposed 2% cap	1.99%
2015–2016	LESS than the state imposed 2% cap (net of the projected debt service decrease)	1.29%
2016–2017	AT the state imposed 2% cap	2.00%
2017-2018	LESS than the state imposed 2% cap (net of the projected debt service decrease)	.00%
2018-2019	More than 2% including waiver for HB	2.46 %

BANKED CAP: The amounts that were below the 2% cap and the amounts the district qualified for Health Benefits waivers in the 3 proceeding years totaled \$1,636,173. This is the amount that was available to increase the 2019-20 budget over the 2% tax levy cap (or 4.54%).





2019-2020 SCHOOL TAX LEVY INCREASE:

TAX LEVY INCREASE = \$1,266,133 1.97%

EXPENSES INCREASE = \$ 703,804 .92%





School Taxes

- **LOCH ARBOUR LITIGATION LOSS**
 - **✓** COURT RULED LOCH ARBOUR COULD CREATE NON-OPERATING SCHOOL DISTRICT
 - **✓ NO LONGER PAY OCEAN SCHOOLS BASES ON HOME VALUES**
 - ✓ OCEAN TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS NOW PAY APPROXIMATELY 2 MILLION MORE DUE TO THE LOSS OF LOCH ARBOUR HOME VALUES
- TOWN WIDE NET VALUATION INCREASE OF 3.3%
 - **✓** BASED ON INDIVIDUAL ASSESSMENT INCREASE TAXES WILL VARY
 - ✓ APPROXIMATE AVERAGE HOME ASSESSMENT OF 475,000 WILL SEE A \$119 INCREASE IN SCHOOL TAXES IN A YEAR





POSITIVE FACTORS:

- Negotiated agreement with the teachers union and mutually agreed upon changes to the Medical base benefit plan for employees and changes to the Prescription plan co-pays and the utilization management plan
- ➤ Health Benefit line item (Medical and Prescription) will decrease by over \$700,000
- Continue implementation of employee health benefits premium contributions, ranging from 3% to 35% of premiums (depending on salary and plan coverage of the individual employee)
 - ✓ Over \$2,700,000 in employee contributions for the 2019-2020 budget
- ➤ 250 KW solar panel system on the Intermediate School roof and 135 KW solar panel system at the High School and have generated \$388,854 in solar renewable energy credits that have been sold (SRECs) and we save approximately \$60,000 per year on our electric bills due to generation of electricity from the solar panels




